1.3 Feedback from Stakeholders:

Analysis of Feedback-Alumni

Feedbacks collected from alumni through questionnaire have been encouraging. Certain constructive pointers have surfaced through an analysis of this exercise.

1. All alumni were unanimous in crediting the college for:

- a) Their present status in life.
- b) Development of leadership skills.
- c) Taking up responsibilities and challenges.
- d) Acquiring education while earning a living as the college, prior to Government take-over (1967-2006), was running Morning shift in addition to Day Shift to facilitate working people to pursue higher education.

Further, all asserted their gratification for being taught by experienced and dedicated faculty. And that the college went beyond being an educational institution, it was a training ground. Looking at the past and present leaders of the state in all fields, many of whom are alumni of the college, it is a clear indicator that the college had been and continues to be a force of progress and development of our people and society.

2. **Constructive suggestions:**

- a) Expansion of library in terms of books and space.
- b) Transportation facility to be improved.
- c) To organize inter-college sports meet.
- d) Conduct seminars for students with well-placed alumni as resource persons.
- e) Faculty in collaboration with alumni to form a think-tank to function as a platform to inspire, and exhort students through talk programs.
- f) To appoint a Chaplin to oversee EU activities and monitor spiritual and moral growth of students.
- g) Allot an office room for Alumni Association.
- h) Conduct alumni meeting once a year.
