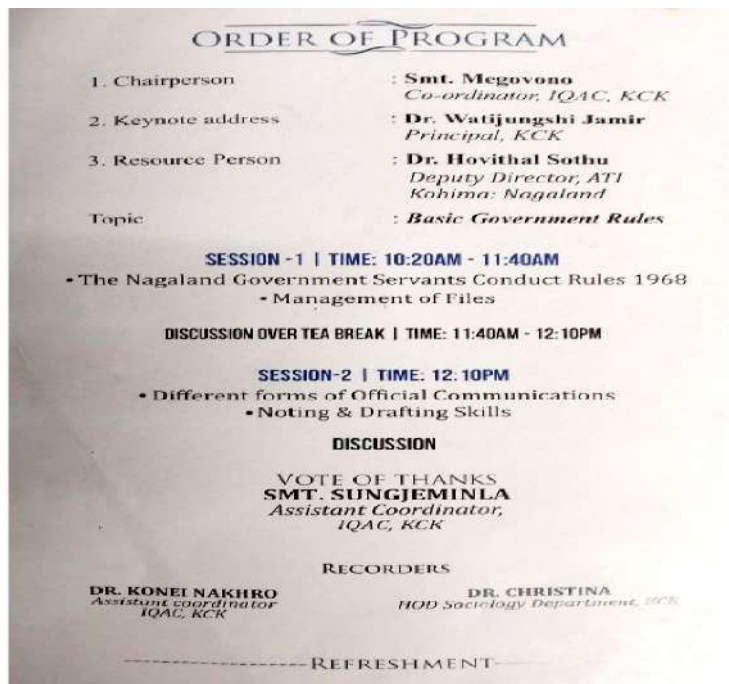
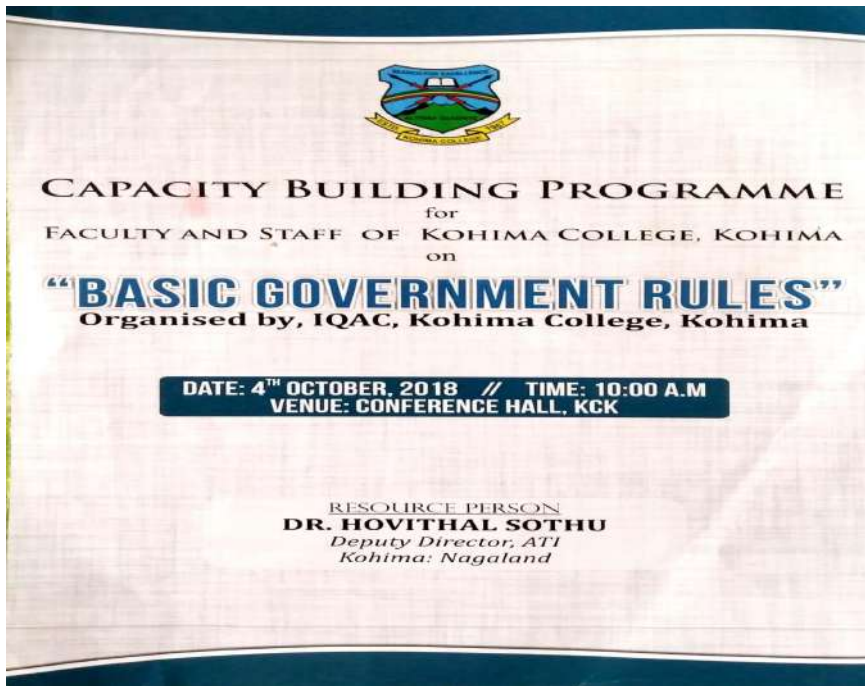

Capacity building prog on basic govt rules held

KOHIMA, OCTOBER 6 (MExN): A one-day capacity building programme on basic government rules was organized by IQAC, Kohima College for the faculty and office staff of the college with resource person Dr Hovithal Sothu, Deputy Director, ATI.

Principal, KCK, Dr Watijungshi Jamir, while delivering the keynote address said that the year 2003 was known as the Year of Capacity Building. He referred to 'capacity' in terms of liquid, solid and aerial mediums - that when anything exceeds its capacity, it bursts or overflows.

He stressed on the need for teachers to increase capacity and maximize effort. He stated that the college teachers and staff have so far been maintaining the UGC service rule of minimum working hours i.e., five hours per day, and that this training program was a golden opportunity for college teachers and office staff to learn basic government rules.

Resource person, Dr Hovithal stated that he had hardly known any service rules during his 10 years of teaching in Kohima Science College, as teachers are always so pre-occupied in engaging with the students and trying to broaden their knowledge of their subjects.

While delivering a detailed explanation of the Nagaland Government Servants Conduct Rules 1968, The Nagaland Services Discipline and Appeal Rules 1967, management of files, different forms of official communications and noting & drafting skills, Dr Hovithal encouraged the teachers and office staff to maintain sincerity, punctuality and devotion in their work ethics. He stressed on the importance of integrity by stating that they should "do what is right even when no one is watching."

REPORT ON

National Seminar: Emerging Debates and Issues in North East India from 14th - 15th November 2019, Organized by Research Cell Kohima College, Kohima, Nagaland

The North Eastern region occupies a very crucial position due to its unique and diverse socio-cultural composition and its strategic location. The advancement of technology in the tribal areas have created huge gap leading to alienation, frustration and distress where many issues have become pertinent to discuss, understand and re-orient policies to suit the North Eastern states. In the backdrop of the above, the seminar was organised to bring out fresh insights on the emerging issues in this academic discourse.

The program began with the Inaugural session at 10:00 A.M with Mrs. Moanungla as the chairperson. The inaugural address was given by Dr. Ralimongla and Dr. Konei Nakhroshared. The road map of the Seminar, a song was presented by the students of KCK and thereafter, the research journal 'Impressions' was released by Dr. Watjijungshi, former Principal KCK. Resource persons for the technical sessions were Scientist-D, Dr. Nesatalu Hiese; Scientist-B, Kekuniel Ltu and technical assistant, Gihukali Chishi from PIC, Nagaland science & technology council, department of science & technology, Nagaland. Earlier, assistant prof. Sungiemlna chaired the inaugural function and a welcome address was presented by KCK principal Dr. Ralimongla.

Report on 'Intellectual Property Rights'

A one day seminar on **Intellectual Property Rights (IPR)** organized by IQAC, Kohima College, Kohima in collaboration with Patent Information Centre (PIC), Nagaland State Science and Technology (NASTEC), Govt. of India was held on 17th April, 2021, at the Conference room, KCK.

Madam Sungjemniha, Assistant Professor, Department of English inaugurated the session and introduced the three resource persons, Dr. Nesatlu Hiese, Scientist-D, Patent Information Centre, Nagaland Science Technology Council, Dept. of Science and technology, Mr. Kekuniel Ltu, Scientist-B, Patent Information Centre, Nagaland Science Technology Council, Dept. of Science and technology, Ms. Gihukali Chishi, Technical Assistant, Patent Information Centre, Nagaland Science Technology Council, Dept. of Science and technology. After which was followed by a warm welcome address from the Principal, Dr. Ralimongla, Kohima College, Kohima.

In the first technical session, **Mr. Kekuniel Ltu, Scientist-B**, Patent Information Centre, NASTEC, Dept. of Science and technology, the resource person highlighted on the Intellectual property rights and its components explaining in detail about IPR and why it's important in academia as well. The components he focused on are patents, trademark, copyright, industrial design, trade secrets, geographical indicator, plant variety protection and farmer's right. In his presentation he informed that the Patent Information Centre, Nagaland was established in 2011, and is the only organization in Nagaland dealing with IPR issues. The IPR support and facilitation centre is set up by the Department of Science and Technology, Government of India and also its linkages with TIFAC, DST-GOI. He also explains the objectives of the centre which are, IPR awareness and consultation among the people in the state; to facilitate universities, industry, governments departments and R&D institutions for patent filing and searches, GI registration, Copyrights, New plant varieties, etc.; IPR cells in Universities/ Institute of Higher Educations; and providing free patent searches. Further, he mentioned that five IPR cells has been set up at-

1. NU-SET, Dimapur under Biotechnology Dept.

2. Patkai Christian College under Geology Dept.
3. Nagaland University, Lumami Campus,
4. Kohima Science College, Jotsoma
5. Dept. of Industries and commerce

Mr. Ltu also mentioned the activities conducted by the department annually such as awareness seminar on IPR to schools, colleges, NGOs, entrepreneurs, departments, farmers, etc.; facilitating in patent filing and searches, GI registration, Copyrights, Trademark, New plants varieties, etc.; carrying out patent search through procured database and post GI awareness. In his presentation he furthermore explained that Intellectual Property Rights (IPR) refers broadly to the creations of the human mind, or an intangible property. IPR can be assigned, gifted, sold and licensed like any other property and it have to be renewed from time to time to keep them enforced. And according to him perhaps this is the only right which can be simultaneously enjoyed in more than one country. He also tells us why IPR is important in academia, the role of Intellectual property (IP) is important during teaching, research and outreach activities, R&D collaboration, technology transfer and entrepreneurship. IP gives protection if one create a product, publish a book, or find a new drug, intellectual property rights ensure that one benefits from one's work. These rights protect one's creation or work from unfair use by others. IP creates and support paying jobs, rewards for inventive faculty and staff, enhanced student entrepreneurship and is a new revenue sources. The components he mentions are patents, trademark, copyright, industrial design, trade secrets, geographical indicator, plant variety protection and farmer's right. Patents are exclusive rights granted to an inventor or applicant to make, use, and sell an invention for a specified number of years. Patent information means that the invention cannot be commercially made, used, distributed or sold without the consent of the owner. Invention may be any product or process or both and it should be novel, involves an inventive step which is not obvious and capable of industrial application and the term is 20 years from the date of filing. He gave a brief overview of traditional knowledge as well. Such as knowledge of indigenous and local communities that has been passed on through generations for its ability to sustain and develop the communities. It includes biological and other materials for medical treatment and agriculture, production processes, designs and literature, music, rituals and other techniques and arts. Also includes bio-diversity related

the term is 18 years from the date of registration. Trade secret are formula, business information, customer information, methodology, strategic plans, etc., they are commercial, have unlimited duration as long as its secret and this type are automatically granted and no legal action is required. Geographical Indications is a name or sign used on certain products which corresponds to a specific geographical location or origin (eg. a town, region or country). It act as a certification that the product possesses certain qualities, is made according to traditional methods, or enjoys a certain reputation, due to its geographical origin. The term of protection is 10 years and it can be renewed indefinitely by paying renewal fee.

The second technical session was on copyrights and trademark presented by **Ms. Gihukali Chishi**, PIC, NASTEC, Dept. of Science and Technology. In her presentation, she explained on copyrights, infringement, trademarks and their categories. Copyright is a form of Intellectual property rights (IPR). It is a bunch of rights in certain creative material such as text, artistic works, music, computer programs, sound recordings and films. The copyright owner has the right to control how their material is used. The definition of copyright is it is an exclusive right given by law for a certain term to an author, composer etc, to print, publish, sell copies etc of his original work. The types of copyright are literary-articles, thesis, poem, question papers, dictionary, encyclopedia, head notes, translation, abridgement, lectures, catalogues; artistic - painting, sculpture, drawing, map, chart; musical - music composition, graphical notation; cinematographic film-videos files; sound recording - sound files. The copyrights Act, 1957 is a statutory rights - reproduce in any material, storing in any medium, issue copies, perform, make film or sound recording, translation, adaptation, sell, rental; a moral rights, right to transfer and right against infringement. The term of copyright for original literary, dramatic, musical and artistic works is of 60 years period which is counted from the year following the death of the author. For cinematographic films- sound recordings, photographs, posthumous publications, anonymous and pseudonymous publications, works of government and works of international organizations - 60 years period which is counted from the date of publication. Performers and broadcasting rights - 25 years. Copyright exist in the expression of the idea in a material form and not just a mere idea. Both published and unpublished work are entitled for copyright. Infringement is unauthorized and illegal reproduction of

knowledge. A case study on turmeric patent was highlighted to make us understand better the rights; in 1995, two Indian nationals at the University of Mississippi Mediacal centre were granted US patent no 5401504 on "use of turmeric in wound healing". The Indian Council of Scientific and Industrial Research (CSIR) requested the US patent and trademark office (USPTO) to re-examine the patent. CSIR argued that turmeric has been used for thousands of years for healing wounds and rashes and therefore its medicinal use was not novel. Their claim was supported by documentary evidence of traditional knowledge, including an ancient Sanskrit text and a paper published in 1953 in the Journal of the Indian Medical Association. Despite arguments by the patentees, the USPTO uphold the CSIR objections and revoked the patent. As a sequel to turmeric and other TK based patents, CSIR in 1999 and the Department of Ayurveda, Yoga and Naturopathy, Unani, Siddha and Homoeopathy (AYUSH), constituted an inter-disciplinary task force for setting up of Traditional Knowledge Digital Library (TKDL) for documentation of existing knowledge available in public domain on various traditional systems of medicine.

Copyright is a type of intellectual property that gives its owner the exclusive right to make copies of a creative work. One can copyright the literary works (eg, all text, including computer software); dramatic works, musical and artistic works, motion pictures and other audiovisual works; producers of cinematographic films and sound recordings, architectural works. In case of literary works, the term of protection is lifetime of the owner plus 60 years and in case of artistic works the term is 60 years and for broadcasting, the term is for 25 years. Trademark protect the unique name, design, logo, symbols or colors used by a business to identify their products or services. The term of protection is 10 years and can be renew indefinitely by paying renewal fees. Industrial design relates to feature of shape, configuration, pattern, ornament or composition of lines or colors applied to any article in 2-d or 3-d or both forms. The term of protection is initially for a period of 10 years and can be renewed for another 5 years by paying renewal fees. The protection for semiconductor IC layout designs includes a layout of transistors and other circuitry and includes lead wires connecting such elements. The term is 10years from the date of filing. The plant variety protection is a system for protection of plant varieties, the rights of farmers and plant breeders and to encourage the development of new varieties of plants. In case of trees and vines,

The last technical session was presented by Dr. Nesatalu Hiese, Scientist-D, PIC, NASTEC, Dept. of Science and Technology, on the topic "Geographical Indication and its opportunities and challenges". In this session, she explained in brief the geographical indication, which is a name or sign used on certain products to protect the unique qualities of a produce that are specific to its geographical origin, the products under GI and also the GI from North East India. GI is a form of IP right meant for empowerment of producer of goods associated with region and also a mechanism that helps producers to differentiate their products from others in the market. GI is also a community rights. Her presentation emphasized on how and why it's important to have our goods and services registered under GI, and the many benefits that can be reaped in doing so. GI is important because it enables local populace to derive economic benefit out of their produce, GI is a marketing tool which benefits farmers and local producers. Its also gives legal protection and prevents from unauthorized use and act as a deterrent to pirates and infringers. This will not only prevent the traditional goods from misuse but also it can gain financial profit by exporting the products to other state/ countries. It also preserves local culture, identity, traditional knowledge and resources. The products under GI can be agricultural - tea, orange, banana, rice, pepper, coffee, tomato, cucumber, mango flower, natural- marble, clay, coal; foodstuff - laddu, bhujia, fermented bamboo shoot, naga dal; manufacturers - agarbathi, Coimbatore wet grinder, leather, perfume, soap, earthen pot; and handicrafts - silk, fabric, shawl, paintings, jewellery, sarees, embroidery, cotton, craft, carving, furniture, toys. The GI from NE India are Arunachal orange and Idu mishini textiles from Arunachal Pradesh; Muga silk, Assam orthodox tea, Assam karbi anglong ginger, Tezpur litchi, Jaha rice of Assam, Kaji nenu and chikuwa rice of Assam from the state of Assam; and Khasi mandarin and memong narang from Meghalaya. In Nagaland, the chakhesang shawls got GI registered in 2017. Here 13 shawls and 2 mekhalas are registered which are of only the original ones and not the recent modern design. The benefits of GI registration are it maintains quality standards of goods, brings customer trust, fetches premium value of goods, market reach of state, national and international level, employment generation and strategy. The speaker also gave in detail on who can apply for GI and about the authorized user and what are the requirements for GI and the responsibilities after getting the goods and products registered.

work of others (whole or part). Makes for sale or hire, fair use does not constitute infringement. Plagiarism is a copyright violation. UGC has brought regulation in 2018 to control it. Any master's, M.Phil, Ph.D student can be penalized for a period of one year if similarities are between 40-60% and if above 60%, penalized for three years. Trademarks protect the unique name, design, logo, symbols or colors used by a business to identify their products or services. Trademark distinguishes goods/ services from one manufacturer from the others. The term of protection is 10 years and can be renewed indefinitely by paying renewal fees. Certain criteria's for trademarks were also mentioned. Regd proprietor of a trademark can stop other traders from unlawfully using his trade mark, sue for damages and secure destruction of infringing goods and services. NCI is an ultimately consumers gets benefit of trademarks for goods and services. NCI is an international classification of goods and services applied for the registration of marks. The international classification of goods and services for the purpose of marks. The international classification of goods and services for the purpose of registration of marks, 1957 at Nice, France. Trademark also has different application types - service mark - represent the service which a company or business deals in; collective mark- these marks are linked with a group of people and not one single product or service, these trademarks are primarily owned by an organization, institute, or any association; Certification mark - the certification mark is created to show a specific quality standard that the company has met and series mark - series marks are trademarks which have a common syllable, prefix or suffix, thus denoting as a family of marks sharing a 'common name'. The speaker further highlighted a trademark infringement case. The Kains District Co-operative milk producers Union Ltd and OCMME has filed trade mark infringement cases against two local shop owners- Amul. The district court, Anand, passed an order ruling that it was clear case of infringement and restrained the two from using Amul trademark. It was concluded that utterly butterly delicious Amul name cannot be used by any other except the proprietor. She also explained further on who can apply and how one can apply with a concluding remark stating protecting your idea is well worth the time and effort.

After the two speakers gave their presentations, there was a short tea break for about 20 minutes.

In conclusion, the presentation aims to facilitate, educate, capacitate and empowering the various stakeholder on importance of protecting, preserving and promoting the indigenous rights of the people.

Dr. Ketoukhriev, Asst. Professor, Department of Political Science wonderfully concluded the program by briefly summarizing the three sessions and highlighting all the important points that one have to be aware of which was followed by vote of thanks from Dr. Theyiesinuo Keditsu, Asst. Professor, Department of English appreciating the esteemed speakers for making time and participating in this one day seminar and sharing their invaluable knowledge with the house.

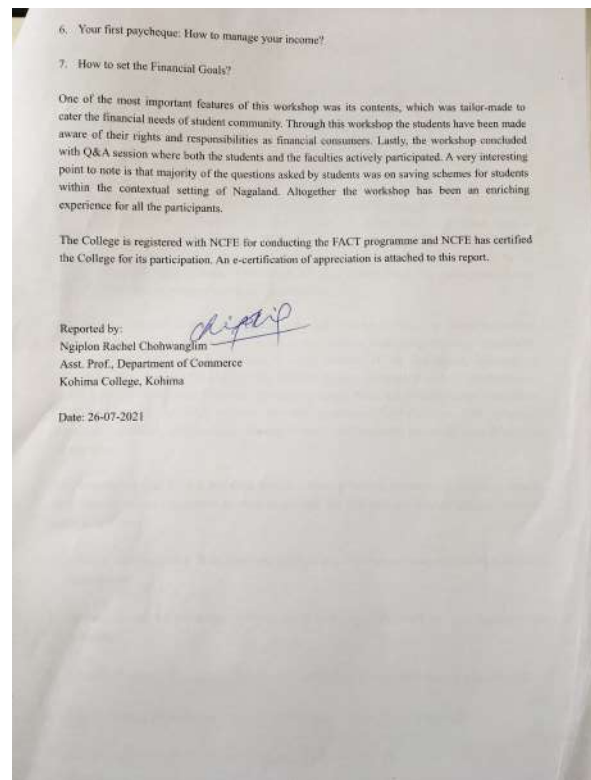
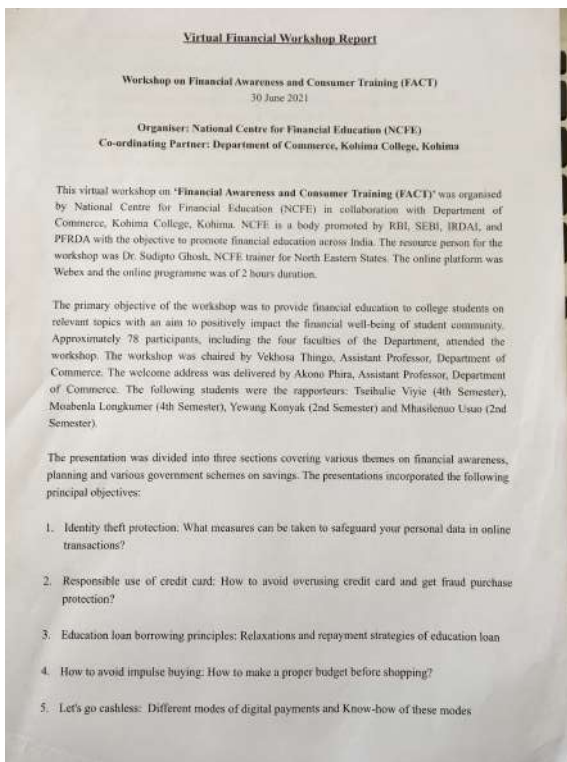

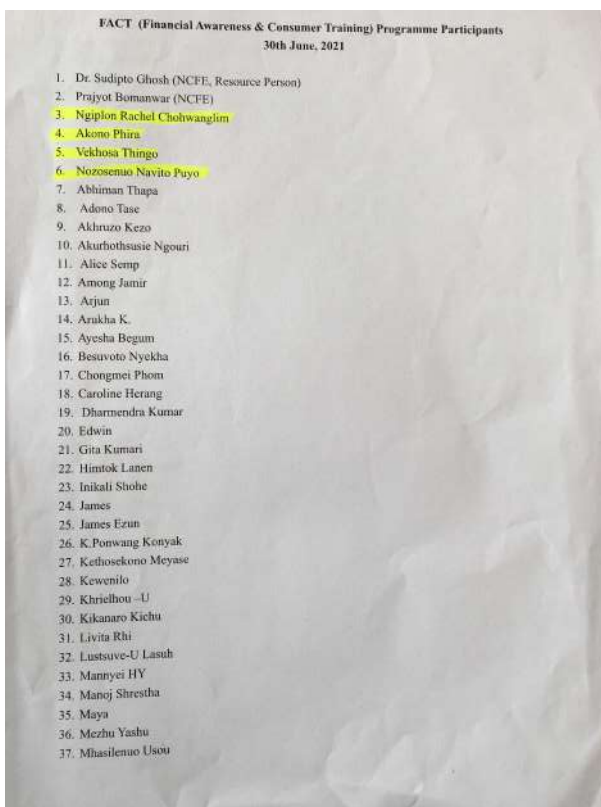

Day 3	- Kurtosis - Histogram - Ogive

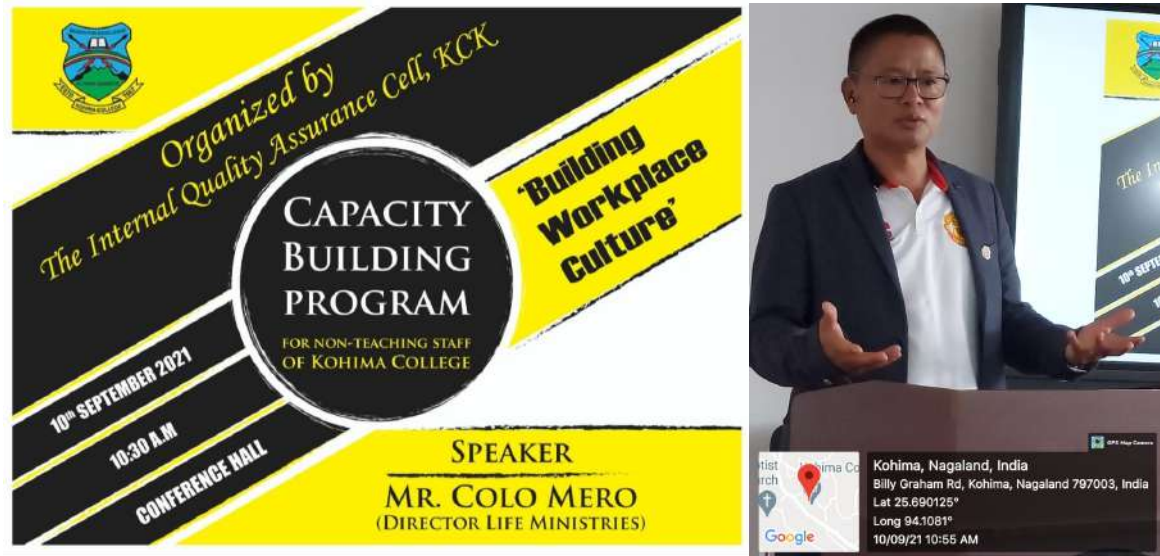

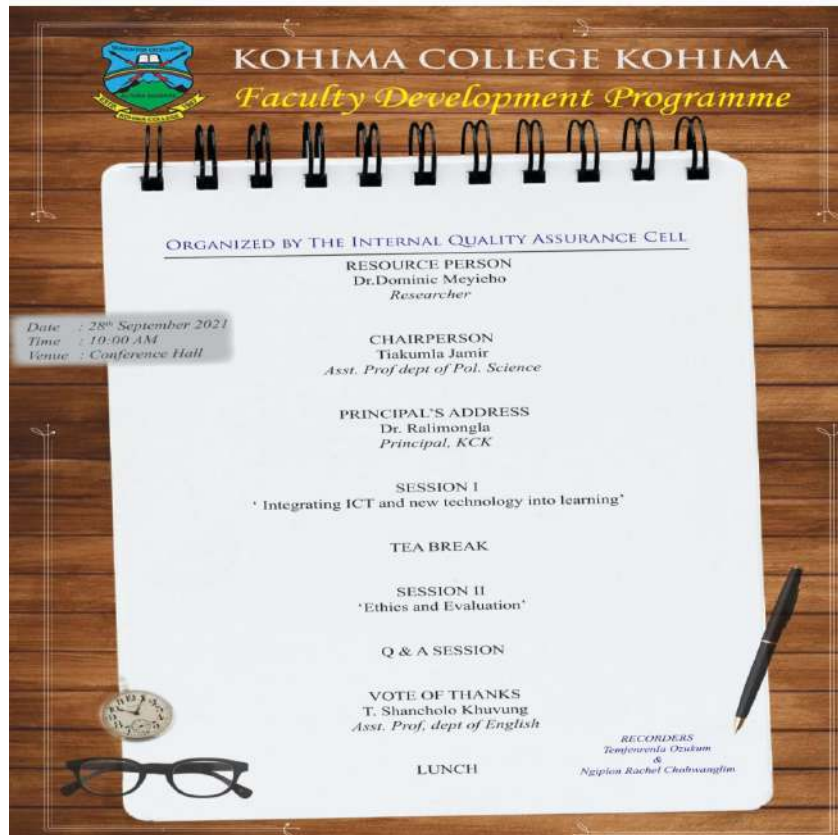

Faculty Development Programme on 'Integrating ICT and New Technology into Learning' and 'Ethics and Evaluation' - 28th September 2021

Report on Faculty Development Programme
Organised by IQAC, Kohima College, Kohima
28 September 2021

This Faculty Development Programme was organised for the teaching faculty of Kohima College, Kohima by IQAC. The Resource person for the programme was Dr. Dominic Meyicho, Researcher. Dr. Meyicho formerly worked as an Assistant Professor in Department of Philosophy at Assam Don Bosco University. The programme was chaired by Tiakumla Jamir, Assistant Professor, Department of Political Science who also moderated both the sessions. The welcome address was delivered by Dr. Ralimongla, Principal, Kohima College, Kohima. Lastly, the vote of thanks was proposed by T. Shancholo Khuvung, Assistant Professor, Department of English.

The primary objective of this programme was to impart Information and Communication Technology (ICT) skills to faculties in order to integrate technology with teaching for effective student learning outcomes. Chairing the sessions, Tiakumla Jamir, highlighted the importance of faculty development programme for improving and enhancing teaching profession. The Principal in her welcome address thanked the IQAC for recognising the need to have such programme and for organising one. Further, the principal welcomed the resource person and faculties for their participation and cooperation. The principal supported the commitment of the teachers and expressed her gratitude for their dedication and sincerity. She emphasised on the need of such programmes, particularly during this pandemic and encouraged the gathering to strive for holistic and professional development as educators.

The programme had two sessions: Session I - Integrating ICT and New Technology into learning, followed by Session II- Ethic and Evaluation. In the first session, Dr. Meyicho, started by giving a broad context on the need for integrating ICT with the teaching-learning process. He explained the four domains for teaching viz; cognitive, affective, psychomotor and technology. The first three domains are the generally accepted domains for teaching however, the fourth domain, which is technology, has gained prominence over the years with the advent of technology integrated approach to teaching. This has made the teaching-learning process more student-focused and interesting for the learners. In the 21st century, the world has transitioned from a period of modernity to post-modernity ushering in new and innovative approaches to teaching and learning. In this present day and age, technology has become indispensable as an effective strategy in addressing complex student learning outcomes. In order to equipped teachers and educators in integrating technology with teaching various online certificate courses are offered through NPTEL-SWAYAM which is a project under taken by the Ministry of Human Resource Development, Government of India. Dr. Meyicho encouraged the teachers to take up such online courses and also advised that teachers should be willing to learn and acquaint themselves with new ways of teaching. He ended the first session by giving a brief highlight on online platforms of teaching such as, WhatsApp, Googlemeet, Webex, Google Classroom, Moodle, Proctur etc.

through NPTEL-SWAYAM which is a project under taken by the Ministry of Human Resource Development, Government of India. Dr. Meyicho encouraged the teachers to take up such online courses and also advised that teachers should be willing to learn and acquaint themselves with new ways of teaching. He ended the first session by giving a brief highlight on online platforms of teaching such as, WhatsApp, Googlemeet, Webex, Google Classroom, Moodle, Proctur etc.

The second session on 'Ethics and Evaluation' saw discussions on some important normative ethical theories such as Utilitarianism (Jeremy Bentham), Deontology (Immanuel Kant) and Categorical Imperatives (Immanuel Kant). Dr. Meyicho highlighted the importance of right evaluation through Bloom's taxonomy. He spoke on the six levels of Bloom's taxonomy; Knowledge, Comprehension, Application, Analysis, Synthesis and Evaluation. He emphasised teachers role in applying all the Bloom's Taxonomy in order to effectively evaluate the students. He emphasised that teachers should exercise evaluation methods that enables students to apply analysis and synthesis.

The second session was followed by Q&A. A question each was asked by two faculty members - 1. Whether the transition to online mode has compromised the quality of education? 2. In our college context, whether syllabus is a factor for predominantly knowledge-based learning? Dr. Meyicho emphasised that technology is only a means and not an end in itself. Thus, technology should not replace teachers but should enhance the teaching learning process. He also believed that syllabus could be a factor for knowledge-based learning in the case of government institutions as most private universities are experiment based.

In the end, T. Shancholo Khuvung proposed the vote of thanks by thanking the resource person and the participants on behalf of the college and IQAC.


Report on mentoring for the implementation of Choice Based Credit System

On 21st September, 2021, IQAC, Kohima College, Kohima organized a mentoring session for the implementation of Choice Based Credit System (CBCS) under the aegis of the Directorate of Higher Education, Govt. of Nagaland. A total of 42 teachers participated in the session. The resource persons for the session were Dr. Seyie Whiso and Dr. Daniel Kibami, IQAC, Kohima Science College, Jotsoma.

Dr. Daniel Kibami started with the session, he explained on choice based credit system (CBCS) which is introduced by the University Grants Commission in a detailed manner about the core courses, ability enhanced compulsory courses, generic elective and skill enhanced courses. He also gave a clarity on how the students can choose different courses based on their interest which is a great opportunity for them to learn and improve their skills and explore various fields.

The second session started after a short lunch break with Dr. Seyie Whiso. In this session, he explained about the grading and credit scores. Instead of percentage wise grading, the CBCS uses a grading and evaluation system to map students' performance. Dr. Seyie also mentioned that the different courses have different total marks.

The mentoring session ended with a note of gratitude from the IQAC member, Dr. Konei where she appreciated the resource persons for taking out their time and enlightening the faculty on choice based credit system.
