COLLEGE PROFILE

Kohima College, Kohima, was established on the 9th of August 1967 and holds the distinction of being the first college in Kohima to offer higher education in the Humanities stream. The college initially began as a private establishment, owing its existence to four far-sighted individuals from Kohima village- Dr. Neilhouzhü Kire, Dr. Satuo Sekhose, Mr. Vibeilie Solo and Mr. Vilalhoulie Belho, who shared a common concern for the need of an academic institution offering higher studies program/s in the field of Humanities as there was none in Kohima at that point of time. In time, Kohima College, Kohima, transitioned into a government college with the Government of Nagaland taking over, with effect from 1st February 2006.

The college is affiliated to Nagaland University and currently offers Under Graduate degree programs in Humanities and Commerce, the latter which was successfully introduced in 2016. The scenic Kruoliezou where the college is presently located, provides a conducive academic atmosphere for students and the area is also considered one of the fastest developing sectors under urban Kohima. The present campus covers a total area of 28.27 acres. The college has a three-storied building constituting three blocks and is equipped with 17 classrooms, 1 Language Laboratory, 1 seminar Hall and an Auditorium. The college has a well equipped automated Library with OPAC and internet facility attached with a Reading room.

College has successfully completed three cycles of assessment (2012, 2017 and 2023) by the National Assessment and Accreditation Council (NAAC) Bengaluru and was accordingly graded B, B+ and B++ respectively. The college with its motto 'Search for Excellence' aspires not only to promote quality education but also to inculcate a sense of fair play, honesty, and integrity amongst the students, motivating them to lead bold, engaged and transformed lives which will add value to our shared community.

Over the years, the college has produced thousands of graduates, including eminent personalities, and continues to make all efforts in pursuit of excellence in Higher Education.

ELIGIBILITY

12th standard passed or equivalent from a recognised board with a minimum of 45% in the subject in which one desires to take up Honours.

ADMISSION POLICY

Admission to Kohima College will follow the principles of the formula devised by the Department of Higher Education 2024.

HOSTEL RULES

- Hostellers are required to attend classes regularly. No one is allowed to be in the hostel during class hours.
- Hostellers going out during the day must fill in the details in the day-out register. It is also mandatory to sign while returning.
- Hostellers must be in the hostel positively by 5:30 pm summer and 5:00 pm winter. Not adhering to these rules may lead to expulsion from the hostel which would automatically mean expulsion from the college.

ACADEMIC RULES

- 1. A Student must fulfill 75% (NU) attendance.
- Any student may be debarred from appearing examinations (Internal/ External) on account of gross violation of college rules and Regulations, Misconduct, Bad Character, Disrespect to college authority, Faculty, Staff or non- payment of any fees of the college, and Nagaland University.
- Admission to Honours is prerogative of the college authority/ HOD of the concerned department.

All Information pertaining to college admission/ examinations/ administration and other related matters will be notified in the Notice Board of the college and via social media channels. Urgent matters will be published in Local Daily. Students must be aware of such information notified/published from time to time by the college authority.

GENERAL NORMS

- Short hair is mandatory for male students during the course of study in the college.
- Students must participate in all official activities of the college such as social gatherings, social work, games and sports events etc. Fines will be imposed on the absentees.
- Tribal organizations within the college are not recognised. Kohima College Students Council (KCSC) is the only recognized student body in the college. Departmental/group excursions, tours and fund raising activities etc., are banned/not allowed.
- To qualify as a member of the Kohima College Students Council (KCSC), one must clear all semester examinations and attain the required attendance percentage.

POLICY

OBJECTIVE

The code reflects the mission and vision of the The purpose of this document is to present the code of conduct for the students of Kohima College Kohima in order to provide a clear statement of the expectations that the college has in respect of academic matters and personal behaviour. All students are expected to read the code and abide by it.

1. RESPONSIBILITY TOWARDS THE COLLEGE

- 1.1 Every student must carry their student's ID while being present on the college campus.
- 1.2 Every student is expected to maintain general cleanliness within the classroom and the campus.
- 1.3 Every student is expected to take good care of the college property. Damage to college property on or off campus is a punishable act.
- 1.4 Every student must provide to the college accurate personal and contact details
- 1.5 Every student must wear clean and proper uniform on uniform days and decent and appropriate dress on non uniform days.
- 1.6 Every student must wear a traditional piece of attire on every Wednesday.
- 1.7 Every student is expected to attend all college functions in college uniform unless otherwise specified.
- 1.8 Every student who intend to represent the college in inter collegiate events shall take prior permission from the college authority.
- 1.9 Every student who participate in activities outside the college is a representative of the college and must behave in a manner consistent with their role.

- 1.10 Every student is expected to attend events of student's seminars/paper presentations etc of the concerned class.
- 1.11 Every student is expected to use the social media carefully and responsibly and must not indulge in any activities that may harm the reputation of the college or its members.

2. RESPONSIBILITY TOWARDS THE MEMBERS OF THE COLLEGE

- 2.1 Every student is expected to conduct themselves as responsible members of the college community.
- 2.2 Every student should greet the teachers wherever they meet them.
- 2.3 Every student is expected to be polite and respectful to everyone, including fellow students, teachers, administrators, support staff and visitors.

3. DISCIPLINE

- 3.1 Every student shall at all times observe the rules and regulations of the college and shall remain answerable to the college authority for its activity and conduct on the college campus.
- 3.2 Use of cell phones during class hour is strictly prohibited.
- 3.3 Consumption of any form of intoxicating products or smoking or using chewing gum, pan masala etc are strictly prohibited.
- 3.4 Spitting inside the classroom is a punishable offence.
- 3.5 Indulging in immoral or disruptive behaviour and activities within the college campus and hostel is strictly prohibited.
- 3.6 Organising tours/excursions without permission from college authority and without teachers accompanying the students are strictly banned.

4. ACADEMIC MISCONDUCT

Academic misconduct is considered a serious offence. A student shall be subject to disciplinary action for any of the following acts:

- 4.1 Using unfair means during exam/tests.
- 4.2 Submitting assignments copied from fellow students.
- 4.3 Using mobile phones other devices with an intend to cheat during exams/ tests.
- 4.4 Habitual negligence of college work.
- 4.5 Absence from internal examination, non submission or late submission of assignments, frequent absence from class etc.

5. LIBRARY

- 5.1 Students are advised to use the library as maximum as possible.
- 5.2 Entry to and exit from the library should be recorded in the Register kept on the counter.
- 5.3 Removing/tearing library materials is prohibited.
- 5.4 Use of mobile phones, iPods etc inside the library is strictly probibited.
- 5.5 Students are to maintain silence and discipline in the library.

ICT & MEDIA

- 6.1 Kohima College owned computers or networks shall not be used for any private or commercial purposes.
- 6.2 Students are prohibited from installing, storing or using unlicensed or pirated software in any college owned computers.
- 6.3 Students are expected to cooperate in ensuring a virus free environment in the college computers.
- 6.4 Students are not allowed to play games from the college computers.
- 6.5 Students are to acknowledge the source/ author whenever internet materials are used for assignments or for any other purpose.
- 6.6 Students are required to check the Notice Board and Website of the college for important announcements.

GRADUATE PROGRAMMES FOR ARTS AND COMMERCE

The College is affiliated to Nagaland University (NU) and offers admissions for Undergraduate courses in Arts and Commerce Stream. The minimum duration of this course is 3 years spread over 6 semesters and a maximum of 5 years (10 semesters) The college offers Honours in eight subjects.

To broaden the horizons of education, the University Grants Commission (UGC) introduced and recommended all institutes of higher education to adopt the Four Year Undergraduate Programme(FYUGP) under the New Education Policy 2020. Following the directives from Nagaland University, Kohima College implemented the FYUGP from the academic session, 2023. We believe that the advantages and the effectiveness that FYUGP offers will make the students' education more holistic.

For successful completion of the course, students must compulsorily perform all tests, assignments, projects, in all the semesters and earn the credits required for qualification.

Minimum attendance of 75% is the criteria to write the end Semester Examination.

QUALITY MONITORING

Internal Quality Assurance Cell

The IQAC coordinates with all other cells to ensure quality benchmarks in all aspects of the college. It is instrumental in planning and monitoring quality assurance and quality enhancement of the college in its mission towards academic excellence.

Admission Committee

The admission committee headed by the Principal, Vice-principal and HoDs monitor the over all admission process. The committee's decision on these issue/s is final and binding.

Internal Evaluation

Assessment of the students is done through tests, assignments, project works, seminars, and peer teaching, the outcome of which is used as a basis for identifying and providing extra care to slow learners through remedial measures.

Attendance

Attendance percentage of every student is monitored monthly. Parents/ guardians of students performing poorly and failing to get the University prescribed 75% in class attendance are called by the principal to ascertain the reasons for irregularity.

Mentoring, Students Counselling and Career Guidance Cell

To make the students academically and socially integrated, this Cell plans out a systematic mentoring program every year to encourage and assure that each student has a faculty (mentor) to fall back on or consult in time of need. It also organises seminars on mental health from time to time, career-oriented programs/interactions with professionals for the final year students. This is to keep them abreast with up-to-date employment trends and options and to help strengthen their decision-making skills.

EXTRA-CURRICULAR AND EXTENSION ACTIVITIES

Kohima College seeks to produce well-rounded and versatile students. Recognising that each student has different talents, the college views extracurricular activities as a means of providing opportunities for students to develop their abilities in various endeavours. The college has a number of extension activities to encourage the participation of the students and teachers in social and community concerns.

- Students Welfare Committee- The committee is responsible for the overall supervision of the Kohima College Students' Council, which is the only recognized students body of Kohima College. It oversees the day-to-day activities of the student community by assisting them through suggestions and advice, whenever required. It also engages the students in community services. Above all, it monitors every decision that is taken by the students' council.
- E.U, NCC, NSS, Red Ribbon Club, Red Cross, Skill Development, Legal Aid Clinic, Friends of Nature Club, Swachh Bharat Abhiyan - The students are encouraged to participate in these different cells which represents the full diversity of students' needs and interests. At the same time, these Cells promote personality and leadership development in the students.
- Grievance Cell- This cell was set up to address problems and complaints of the students regarding academic matters and other issues with regard to students' welfare through the college authorities. Suggestion boxes are placed in the college through which the students express their suggestions and grievances.
- 4. Alumni Association- Formedon 29th of August 2011, the Association facilitates reunion of all its past pupils to establish a sense of belonging among the alumni community. The Alumni Association is a platform for the alumni to express their expert and experienced views and provide an avenue for their active participation in the development of the institution. The association's purpose is to be a strong and dependable pillar for the college to mentor and generate sincere, committed participation in all its developmental activities.
- Anti-Ragging/Anti-Discrimination Cell- This cell is empowered to take disciplinary action against any student/s, indulging in ragging, indiscipline behaviour, discriminating on the basis of race, sex, religion, disability, etc., which causes or may cause hardship, psychological harm, or induce fear in a fresher/s or any other student.

- 6. Anti-Sexual Harassment Cell-As per UGC, NAAC and Supreme Court guidelines, Kohima College has constituted this cell within the college premises with the core objective to create a safe, healthy and congenial academic environment for both staff and students alike, free from gender-based discrimination and sexual harassment. It organizes gender sensitization programmes and redresses any complaints of sexual harassment.
- Parent-Teacher Association (PTA) The PTA has been set up to facilitate and encourage parental participation in Kohima College, Kohima.
- 8. Research Activities- This cell strives to nurture research culture in the institute by promoting research activities on emerging trends, keeping in view multidisciplinary facet/s. It also aims to create awareness and opportunity in research and development among faculty and students. It publishes Impressions, the annual research journal.

NEED-BASED GRANT-IN-AID

The Need-Based Grant-in-Aid was initiated by the then-honourable Governor of Nagaland, P.B Acharya, in the year 2017. The purpose of the grant is to help create equal opportunities and access to education for those students who come from underprivileged families. In an effort to encourage such students not to drop out of college, the college aims to provide a safe and inclusive environment and also inculcate in donors and recipients alike a sense of responsibility in giving back to society. A one-time grant will be given covering the total amount of the admission fee for one semester. Exceptions may be made to extend the financial aid to the same student for another semester depending on the student's need after the committee has done proper scrutiny and verification of the circumstances.

Eligibility Criteria

- Students from any semester, who is either an orphan or with a single nonsalaried parent or have parents with physical or mental disabilities or have another sibling studying in the college, etc.
- The student can be either a general or Honours student. He/she must maintain a good grade point.
- Non-academic achievements, for e.g., excellence in sports or the display of other good qualities can also be considered.

Students can approach the Grant-in-Aid Committee for the form.

STUDENTS AWARDS

SCHOLARS BADGE

This award is instituted by the college to acknowledge excellence in academics.

Eligibility:

- Highest CGPA scorer in Commerce, Economics, Education, English, Functional English, History, Political Science, Sociology, Tenyidie
- 2. Only for 4th, 5th and 6th Semester students
- 3. Minimum 75% class attendance as per Nagaland University guidelines
- 4. Must clear all papers in every semester.
- 5. This academic achievement can be won multiple times.

- Cash prize of Rs. 5,000/- (only in the 6th semester to the highest CGPA holder from the college).

ALUMNI MERITORIOUS AWARD

The Alumni Association KCK gives this award which consists of a certificate and a cash prize of Rs. 10,000/-, to felicitate and encourage meritorious students in university exams.

POLITICAL SCIENCE DEPARTMENT AWARD

- The prize is sponsored by Political Science Department, KCK. The award consists of a citation and Rs. 5,000/-in cash.

HISTORY DEPARTMENT MERITORIOUS TOPPER AWARD

This award consists of a commendation certification, and a cash prize of Rs. 5,000/- is given to the highest scorer in History (Honours). The student must have cleared all semesters without any backlogs, with a CGPA score of 6 and above. The award is sponsored by the History Department, KCK.

LATE VIKHOZOLIE TOPPER AWARD

This Award was constituted in 2015. Since 2021, the Award is renamed after late Vikhozolie Chücha, who was serving as an assistant professor at Kohima College, Kohima. This Award is bestowed on any economic student/students who tops in the university examination. It comes with a citation and a cash award of Rs. 5,000/-

DR. SATUO SEKHOSE STAR PUPIL AWARD

Named after one of the founding members of the college, Dr. Satuo Sekhose Star Pupil Award is an annual excellence award given to one exceptional student every year. This award is accordingly sponsored by the family of Lt. Dr. Satuo Sekhose.


The following criteria, terms and conditions shall be followed in respect of the annual award.


- 1. The award will be given to an outgoing student of the 6th Semester
