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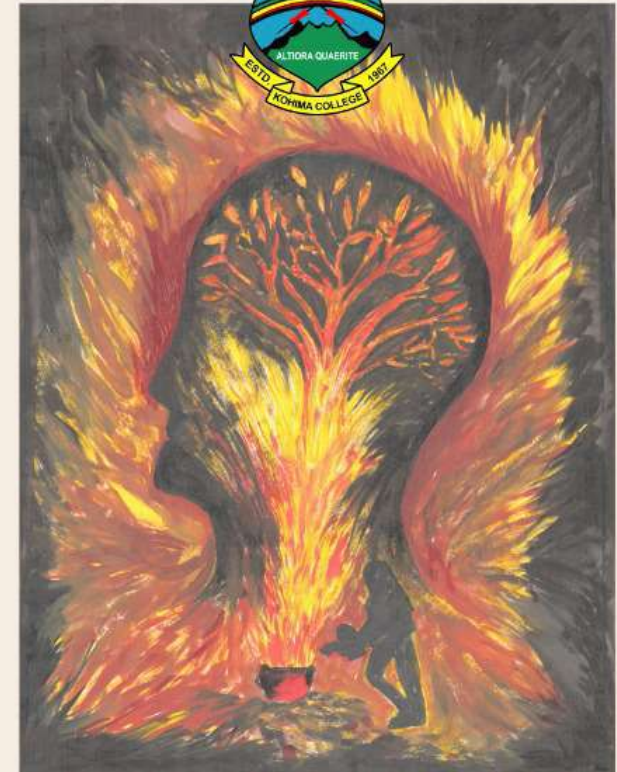

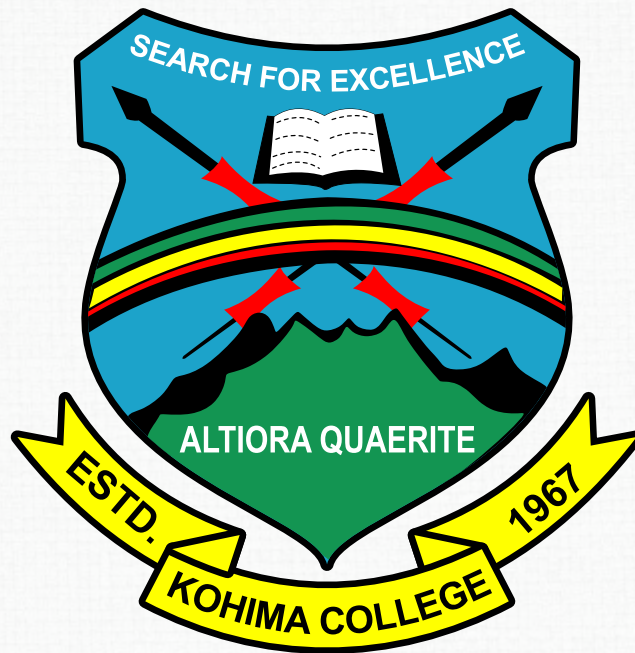

## From the Principal's Desk

I am delighted to pen down a few lines again as a prologue to this year's College magazine. Kohima College, Kohima started the academic session 2024-25 with a distinction – highest enrolment of 1897 students among the 17 Government Colleges in the state. It was also marked with the introduction of Post Graduate programmes in History and Political Science in the college and for which the college is grateful to the Department of Higher Education, Government of Nagaland and the Nagaland University.

The year had been an eventful and successful year packed with activities and programmes. Among the many achievements, I am thankful to the EVS department and Friends of Nature, KCK for the successful conduct of Green Audit on the college by the Nagaland Pollution Control Board in July, 2024. The College could also pen down a few Memorandums of Understanding (MoUs) with some premier institutes/organizations. The college could successfully complete several batches of UNXT Program conducted by UNATI over the year. The college also officially established the Students Counselling Centre on 9<sup>th</sup> August, 2024. I congratulate the Research and Development Cell (RDC) for successfully bringing out the latest edition of the "Impressions" (a Peer Reviewed Journal) of the college.

On the infrastructural development front, the college could complete two classrooms from its own internal resources. The college signboard at the entrance gate had been replaced to provide a facelift. The Conference Hall has been renovated with a modern touch. A four-room building with a small sitting room is also under construction to house the PG classes from internal resources available.

To encourage research activities, the college also funded two Research Projects internally and awarded Rs. 50,000/- to each team. The year also witnessed




the participation of the KCK Football Team in the NSF Martyr's Football Trophy, 2024 which greatly ignited the joy of the college community. The KCK Team also participated and won the Championship Trophy during the ANCSU Sports Meet, 2024.

The 57<sup>th</sup> College Foundation Day on 9<sup>th</sup> August, 2024 was celebrated with a difference where, besides various Awards being presented to the meritorious students, a singing competition was held on the College Anthem to further promote the song among the students and faculty. Towards fostering better unity, the Skill Development Cell, KCK also organized the Annual Fete Day, Winter Wonderland, on 8<sup>th</sup> November, 2024 which also featured a Departmental Christmas Tree Decoration Competition. In collaboration with 4Front Event Management, Kohima College hosted the Miss Kohima Beauty Pageant, 2024 at the College premise.

I congratulate the Magazine Committee for bringing out this issue of the College magazine very successfully.

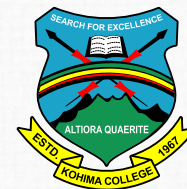

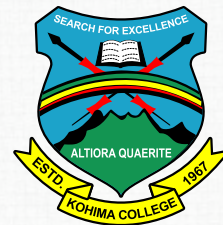

# BEYOND BOOKS

*"A Library is a building in which collections of books, newspapers, etc. and sometimes films and recorded music are kept for people to read, study or borrow."* as defined by the Oxford Learner's Dictionary.

Libraries are of different types. A type of library is an Academic Library. An academic library is a place where students and faculty members can access a wide range of resources to support their studies and research. Generally, academic libraries keep books, journals, and other materials in line with the subjects taught at the institution and which are organized and made accessible by information professionals. It supports the faculty in teaching and research programmes and encourages life-long learning among students. Students can learn the skills of research, the use of library resources and benefit from the library in their coursework and assignments.

Library etiquette is crucial for a conducive learning environment and the valuable resources that it holds. Encouraging the library users to treat the library mindfully instils a sense of responsibility and respect for shared resources. There are some key points to be noted when using a library.

It is a good practise to always present your Library Card when visiting the library. In technological driven libraries of today, the membership Smart Card of a patron is necessary for identification and to access the library and its resources with the automated library in-house operations. The smart card of a patron is scanned on entry and exit points which yields important statistical data for the library. The card allows the patron to avail the membership privileges that the library offers. With the card, one can borrow books, return, renew, or reserve books; avail services such as referencing periodicals, reference books, consulting the online catalogue; avail facilities like the reading room, accessing e-resources, computers,



internet, reprographic service and so on. The smart card is also essential in systematically recording and keeping track of the patron's transactions in the library.

The borrowing rules of a library is designed to ensure that the library's resources are shared fairly. Borrowers should return borrowed materials on time as overdue books can hinder others waiting to access the same resources, or exceed the privilege of borrowing more books, and it also incur late fines. If the borrower needs more time with a book, they can always request an extension or renewal as long as it is not reserved by others.

Most libraries follow Open Access System to browse shelved books. It is expected from the users of the library to place books in its original shelving order after browsing, and thereby, maintain the shelving scheme that libraries adhere to. Improperly shelved books make it difficult for others to locate items they need. Alternatively, instead of reshelfing randomly, consider placing the books on designated tables so that the library staff can shelve it correctly. It is also recommended to consult the Online Public Access Catalogue that displays available items in assigned shelving spots where one can easily locate and retrieve an item, and avoid disheveling the shelves by random browsing and shelving. However, returned books and books from the reading table are to be submitted to the library staff in the Circulation Area or in the book bins. These books need to be checked-in and shelved in its correct assigned shelving spot by the library staff.





Proper care of books ensure they remain in good condition for other readers. Handle books with clean hands to keep them free from dirt or stains, avoid writing on the pages, or tearing pages, use book marks to mark pages instead of folding. Avoid damaging the technically processed spine labels, barcode stickers, and tearing or pulling off of the book slips. Many libraries offer digital collections. Treat digital books with the same respect as physical ones. Avoid sharing your login information and follow the borrowing rules.

Many libraries allow students to use laptops, tablets, and smartphones for coursework. It is essential to use these devices responsibly and to refrain from engaging in non-academic activities. Put electronic devices on silent mode, use headphones when listening to audio and watching videos, step outside the library for phone calls to avoid disrupting the atmosphere of the library. When using library computers or accessing the internet, familiarize yourself with the library's policies regarding computer usage. Avoid visiting inappropriate websites. Respect any restrictions on downloading or installing software. Photographs and videos of the library are to be taken with permission.

A library is a place for focussed study, reading and researching. Respecting the personal space and not disrupt the concentration of others by reading aloud, engaging in conversations or speaking loudly ensures that everyone can learn comfortably. Library users are

expected to sit properly on the chairs and not on the tables, recline in the chairs, feet up on the furniture or sleep on the table.

Be considerate of other library users. Limited resources such as reading rooms or computer stations often come with allotted time constraints. Being mindful of others' time ensures fair access of the available resources for all students.

Library is a shared space for learning where personal belongings cannot encroach upon others' workspaces and also to ensure that library resources are not unfairly bagged, visitors are required to leave personal belongings such as bags, umbrellas etc in the Property Counter, and keep valuables with them for safety.

Maintaining cleanliness is essential for a pleasant library environment. Chairs and tables are to be returned to their positions after use, trash to be disposed of in bins. Food and drinks are prohibited in libraries to preserve the materials and to avoid the potential of spills and crumbs that can be damaging to books and other materials.

It is good to familiarize oneself with the essentials of library conduct and follow them. As educators and aspiring students, it is important to model good conduct to fellow users, to foster a culture of respect, and to take pride of our learning space.
