

#### Introduction

Kohima College, located in the scenic hillock of Kruoliezou, Kohima, was established on the 9 August 1967. This educational institute holds the distinction of being the first private college offering higher education in the branch of Humanities for the first time in Kohima. The College owes its existence to the founding members; Dr. Neilhouzhü Kire, Dr.Satuo Sekhose, Mr. Vibeilie Solo and Mr. Vilalhoulie Belho, four far sighted individuals from Kohima Village, who shared a common concern which was the need for an Academic Institution in the capital. Since its inception, the college has been doing a yeoman's service especially for the economically weaker section of the society because of its negligible fee structure with good facilities. The Government of Nagaland took over Kohima College on 1st February 2006. The College is affiliated under Nagaland University and has gone through the 3<sup>rd</sup> cycle of assessment by NAAC with grading of B++ and is recognised under section 2(f) & 12(B) under UGC Act 1956. Currently, the college offers B.A and B.Com programmes along with masters' programme in Political Science and History. With around 75 teaching faculty and 40 plus non-teaching staff, the college has an enrolment of more than 1900 students. A number of

vocational courses have also been introduced to give the students opportunity to explore career pathways and equip them with employability skills while still in college. Extension activities are encouraged to promote social responsibility and holistic development. The institute's Code of ethics/conduct guides all stakeholders of the College on its principles of integrity, accountability, inclusiveness, commitment and sustainability and all works within the institutional policies and practices to fulfil the Vision and Mission statement of the College.

#### Challenges faced

Currently the college faces a serious shortage of infrastructural facilities to accommodate 1900 plus students, faculty and staff. The college is in dire need of more classrooms, computer lab, library rooms, auditorium, common room for boys and girls students, faculty room, office room for various committees and cells, toilets, etc. Students face transportation difficulties due to shortage of College Buses and also due to the location of the college and the expensive taxi fares.

#### **Way forward: Future Plans**

The College has the following plans for future progress and development of quality education in the state.

- 1. To introduce **Post-Graduate programmes** in all departments.
- 2. To introduce **Vocational and Skill-based courses** in under-graduate levels.
- 3. To introduce **more disciplines** along the line of **multi-disciplinary** education vision of NEP 2020.
- 4. To introduce **Research Programmes such as Ph.D, and Research Projects** for faculty and students.
- 5. To develop more courses for Skill Enhancement Course, Value Added Courses and Multi-Disciplinary Courses to be taught under Nagaland University.
- 6. To establish a **Skill and Innovation Hub** in the college based on the principle of *Naga Morung* where students will be trained on skills necessary for employability in 21st century along with Naga traditional morals and values.
- 7. To set up the **Centre for Naga Indigenous Knowledge Systems** to house resources on studies related of the Nagas and to research and document on the Naga knowledge systems.
- 8. To rigorously implement various activities under the Two Best Practices of the College namely Cultural Conservation and Bridge Project-Connecting Academic Institution to Local Communities.

- 9. To conduct more **capacity building programmes** for students on leadership, good and responsible citizens.
- 10. To effectively carry out **mentoring and counseling** activities for the students.
- 11. To conduct **awareness programmes on equity, accessibility and quality education** especially for Economically Disadvantaged Groups, STs, SCs and PWD students.
